

# MEETING WITH LEGISLATORS TOOLS & TIPS

## Know your audience.

Know how this legislator voted on past production incentive bills (cheat sheet on pages 2-3 below). Know if he/she cosponsored the bill. Be sure to say **thank you for good votes**. For the legislators who didn't do the right thing last time, be brave enough to say, "I hope we can count on you this time."

# Stay "on message."

Many meetings are ineffective because a participant brings up other issues or strays from the key arguments supporting your position.

#### Our message is:

We want to keep film in Washington and to do that we need to renew the Motion Picture Competitiveness Program (MPCP). Last year we had to turn away 6 projects in January that would have generated an estimated \$107 million of economic activity.

Since 2007, film projects approved by the MPCP have brought in an estimated \$116 million in direct in-state spending and created over 17,500 jobs for Washington residents. In June 2017 (when the program sunsets), a decade of progress will be lost if action is not taken. Please renew the MPCP this legislative session.

# **DON'T**

- Go "off-message" or discuss unrelated issues.
- Engage in partisan critiques.
- Use threats.
- Be late.
- Get too comfortable.
- Forget to follow-up.

#### Supporting arguments:

- For every \$1 we invest in film, we generate \$10 in economic boosts for our communities.
- Our creative economy depends on attracting and keeping the professionals of the film industry working in Washington.
- No dollars are paid out until after projects have invested in Washington State.

# Go local. Really local. Really, really local.

Legislators want to hear your thoughts and opinions because you are a constituent. One of your most useful strategies is to relate the issue and your position to yourself. **Tell your personal story, why you care.** Facts and figures don't stick, but personal stories about why film is important do.

### This is important to me because....

#### Make a clear, actionable request.

Many people are afraid that it's impolite to make a direct request. But, don't forget that the purpose of your meeting is to secure support for our issue. Legislators know you want something, so make the ask.

• ASK 1: "Can I count on you to vote yes to renew funding for the production incentive program when it comes up for a vote this year?"

Don't be put off by a no or a maybe. Leave the door open for a follow-up.

• ASK 2: "Will you think about it a little more? This is very important to us, back home. I'm going to send you some more information, can I count on you to take a look?" Then follow-up with info.
